

Proposed Charter of Pueblo de Esperanza

Name: Pueblo de Esperanza

Purpose: The goal of Pueblo de Esperanza is to provide awareness to the campus and the Wooster community regarding the political, cultural, social, and environmental concerns of Latin America and the global community at large. We heighten awareness through educational seminars and discussions. We are also committed to acting out social justice. To this end, we sell Fair Trade Coffee, coordinate volunteers to teach English for Speakers of Other Languages, and are often involved in an annual trip to Ft. Benning, Georgia to protest the School of the Americas. In an effort to accomplish our goals, we shall abide by the Code of Social Responsibility as stated in the Scot's Key.

Membership: Membership is open to all students who wish to participate and does not require any membership fees. Membership shall be open to any member of the College community regardless of age, sex, race, creed, national origin, handicap, sexual orientation, political affiliation, economic status, or the ability to pay dues, providing the individual expresses a genuine interest.

New Member Process: None.

Officers: Pueblo has two Co-facilitators that organize and delegate responsibilities. All officers shall be degree-seeking students at the College of Wooster.

Advisors: The advisor to Pueblo is responsible for overseeing the groups' projects and makes recommendations based on their experience and knowledge. Our advisor will be a member of the College administrative staff, faculty, or other staff member who has received approval of her/his supervisor. Their responsibilities are outlined in the Advisor Contract and those agreed upon by the advisor and our organization according to the recommended responsibilities listed in the Advisor Contract.

Affiliations: Pueblo works with the Immigrant Worker Project and Equal Exchange (Fair Trade Coffee) but does not have any official affiliations. We do realize that any policies of our affiliate affecting our organization must be consistent with College policies.

Amendments: Amendments to this charter shall be approved by a two-thirds vote of our organization. In addition, Campus Council must approve all amendments to this charter.
