**Charter of The Philosophy Club**  
(aka Philosophy Roundtable)

**NAME:** The Philosophy Club (aka Philosophy Roundtable)

**PURPOSE:** The Philosophy Club (aka Philosophy Roundtable), an academic organization within the Department of Philosophy at The College of Wooster, makes available weekly lectures by outside speakers. Department of Philosophy faculty, and Department of Philosophy seniors (in conjunction with Philosophy 452, Senior Independent Study), focusing on broadening the knowledge of philosophy students outside of the classroom. Weekly meetings are open to any interested individuals: students, faculty, staff, community members. In our efforts to accomplish our goals, we shall abide by the Code of Social Responsibility as stated in The Scot's Key.

**MEMBERSHIP:** Membership in this organization shall be open to any member of the College and Wooster community regardless of age; sex, race, creed, national origin, handicap, sexual orientation, economic status, political affiliation, or the ability to pay dues, providing the individual expresses a genuine interest. No membership dues will be collected.

**NEW MEMBER PROCESSES:** None.

**OFFICERS:** All officers for this academic organization shall be degree-seeking students at The College of Wooster. The President(s) for this organization is chosen in the Spring for the following year. The President(s) assists the Faculty Advisor to the Philosophy Club in organizing Philosophy Club events.

**ADVISOR:** The Faculty Advisor to the Philosophy Club - who will be a member of the faculty in the Department of Philosophy - will work closely with the Philosophy Club President in the organization of Philosophy Club events. The Faculty Advisor to the Philosophy Club is responsible for scheduling speakers and for working closely with the Club President in making arrangements necessary to facilitate speakers. The Faculty Advisor to the Philosophy Club's responsibilities will also include those required by the Advisor Contract and those agreed upon by this organization according to the recommended responsibilities listed in the Advisor Contract.

**AFFILIATION:** None.

**AMENDMENTS:** The active members of the Philosophy Club are the persons solely responsible for amending this charter. Amendments can then be approved - but not altered - by Campus Council. Amendments will be decided by a two-thirds vote, to be carried out by the active members of the Philosophy Club
